

#### INTRODUCTION:

To report on Council's current investments.

#### **ISSUES:**

Council is authorised by s625 of the Local Government Act to invest its surplus funds. Funds may only be invested in the form of investment notified by Order of the Minister dated 29 November 2000.

The Local Government Financial Management Regulations prescribe the records that must be maintained in relation to Council's investments. The regulations also require that the responsible accounting officer provide a written report to each ordinary meeting of the Council giving details of all monies invested and a certificate as to whether or not the investments have been made in accordance with the Act, the regulations and Council's Investment Policy No: 3.02.07.

Details of all investments are shown on the attachment sheet titled "Details of cash investments and analysis of investment performance as at 28 February 2005" and in the attached graphs.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

The budget provision for income from this source is \$2.825M. Income to 28 February, 2005 is \$1,924,924. On present trends our budget provisions should be met.

Council relies on a mixture of managed funds and some direct longer term deposits with Banks for its investments. Councillors will note that we upgraded our expectations in the December Quarterly report, anticipating an income of \$2.825M - an increase over the budget projection of \$2.4M. This increase has been achieved by two means. First, in

relation to managed funds, Council retains professional advisors to provide independent and objective advice on our investment portfolio, to ensure prudent investment of our funds. Currently our objective is to invest seeking 50+ basis points above index with a high tolerance to monthly volatility, using a diversified selection of credit rated funds. Recently Council closed out of the Deutsche Cash Plus Fund, the Macquarie Diversified Treasury Fund and the UBS Credit Enhanced Cash Fund, and switched into the Deutsche Income Fund, the ING Enhanced Cash Trust and the Merrill Lynch Diversified Credit Fund following advice from our advisors.

These adjustments to the portfolio were made during the current month and are expected to yield a higher result but there may be more volatility. The increased yield overall from investments is the result of better returns together with additional funds being available over longer periods than was originally anticipated. However, it is not expected that Council will be able to maintain this level of investment cash in the next budget, due to the capital works program which has been planned and which will require access to funds. This may be offset to some extent as the result of higher interest rates that will flow from recent adjustments to interest rates made by the Reserve Bank of Australia.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

All surplus cash has been invested as at 28 February 2005 in accordance with Policy No: 3.02.07 and the provisions of s625 of the Local Government Act have been complied with.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

That the "Director, Governance & Financial Services' Report No. 12/2005 dated 15 March 2005 in relation to the investment of Council funds be noted.


