INTRODUCTION:

Randwick City Council, together with Woollahra, Waverley, Botany, Leichhardt and Sydney City has supported the Eastern Region Local Government Torres Strait Islander Forum for the past 8 years. One of the major projects organised by the forum and its coordinator, is to stage the annual Pauline McLeod Reconciliation Awards student art competition, exhibition and awards presentation night.

The forum had requested that Randwick City Council host the 2008 Awards presentation night in May 2008.

ISSUES:

The Award aims to recognise people whose actions have promoted reconciliation and improved the quality of life for people of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander background in Randwick City and the areas covered by the participation Councils.

INTRODUCTION:

Following the successful Sydney Seniors Film Festival which was held during Seniors Week 2007, The Festivalists have written to Council seeking sponsorship and support for Young at Heart 2008. Due to an overwhelming response, the proposed program of events, screenings and activities will once again be held at the Randwick Ritz Cinema from 6–13 April 2008.

The 3rd edition of **"The Young at Heart Film Festival,"** is presented by The Festivalists, a Sydney-based, "not-for-profit" organisation dedicated to presenting work that enriches cultural diversity and experience for all audiences. For the third year running, the event will be supported and co-presented by The Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care (DADHC). The Film Festival offers 8 days of screenings, documentaries, events, panel discussions, short film awards and parties for Seniors, their families and friends.

The theme for NSW Seniors Week 2008 will again be "LIVE LIFE!", 2008 also marks 50 years of Senior Week celebrations. The activities, events and opportunities offered at the Young at Heart Film Festival reflect the LIVE LIFE theme, through the promotion of social interaction, active lifestyle and community participation. The Festival also provides an opportunity for Seniors to connect with others in the local community.

The Festival is the only NSW film cultural event dedicated exclusively to Seniors. In 2007 Young at Heart attracted over 1800 admissions to its 19 screenings by providing an excellent program and range of activities at affordable prices. It is anticipated that the popularity of The Festival will continue to grow as a main goal of the Sydney Seniors Film Festival is to ensure that scheduling, access and pricing allow people of all economic backgrounds and physical abilities to take part in the event.

The proposed activities and workshops also provide a real opportunity for residents of the Randwick to take part in an event at their doorstep without the inconvenience of travelling far and being in a familiar environment. The Festival aims to target Seniors of all backgrounds living in and around the local government area and promote values that are aligned with the City such as inclusivity, cultural diversity and creativity.

The Festival and its associated events and activities have been supported and organised in consultation with Council's Older Persons Reference Group.

ISSUES:

A main goal of the Festival is to dissolve generation barriers and achieve community integration by:

- Ensuring the program reflects the variety of cultures, lifestyles, languages and traditions of the incredibly diverse senior's population of the Metropolitan Sydney Area.
- Providing an affordable event together with free workshops which aim to teach Seniors in the Community valuable skills in a fun and informal environment. Seniors will have learning opportunities to develop new skills in the following areas: Creative Writing, Camera and Acting. The Festival's volunteer program also provides individualised support to Seniors of Randwick City and the Sydney Metropolitan area to extend their interest and knowledge of the film industry.

In addition to Council's support, confirmed sponsors for Young at Heart 2008 include The Department of Ageing, Disability and Home Care (DADHC), leading Investment and Banking Provider ABN AMRO, Audio Clinic and Air Caledonie Internationale. The Ritz Cinema is once again the official venue partner and has great support from institutions such as NSW Film and Television Office. Evaluations of the 2nd edition of the Seniors Film Festival identified more than 50% of the attendees were residents of Randwick City (including the following suburbs: Coogee, Clovelly, Randwick, Maroubra, Matraville, Malabar, Chifley and La Perouse.

By sponsoring Young at Heart 2008, Randwick City Council and its residents will benefit from the success of the film festival and ensure that the event remains in Randwick.

The Festivalists also aim to work with the Randwick Tourism Committee to ensure that all opportunities to promote Randwick through the festival are seized intelligently. It is important to note, to ensure this occurs The Festivalists will be working in partnership where possible with community groups and residents of Randwick, promoting community participation and a sense that the Young at Heart Festival truly belongs to Randwick.

The sum of \$5,000 is available in the current Community Programs & Partnerships' budget and a further \$3,000 is requested via the 2007/08 Contingency Fund.
