Subject: Working From the Ground Up - Family Fun Day

Introduction

On 11 September 2011, Jude Irwin – Professor of Social Work and Social Justice, Chief Investigator of Working From the Ground Up (WFGU) wrote to the Mayor requesting contribution (financial and in-kind support) towards the planning and running of its second Family Fun Day in the City's southern suburbs. The event will take place on 25 November 2011, at Matraville Memorial Park (property of Housing NSW) from 3.00pm to 7.00pm.

Issues

WFGU is an Australian Research Council Linkage research project being undertaken in the public housing estates of South Maroubra and Matraville by the University of Sydney and the University of NSW, in partnership with Housing NSW, Health NSW and TAFE NSW. WFGU aims to tackle issues associated with social exclusion and disadvantages in social housing neighbourhoods through community development initiatives. One of the initiatives is to hold Family Fun Days.

The Family Fun Day is designed as an opportunity for residents to gain information of community services, celebrate their diversity and to develop relationships with the local community.

WFGU has requested financial and in-kind support from a number of key agencies, including Randwick City Council to hold the Matraville Family Fun Day on 25 November 2011.

Financial support is requested for the provision of a jumping castle, a petting zoo, face painting and a clown (valued at \$3,210). In-kind assistance is requested for the provision of additional litter bins, cleaning services after the event, two mobile toilets and the use of Council marquees (valued at \$790). Earlier this year, the Council had made a similar contribution through its Community Development Budget for the WFGU's first Family Fun day held at Maroubra.

Under normal circumstances, WFGU should have applied for funding through the Council's Community Partnerships Funding Program (held in April 2011) or through its Cultural Community Program (held August 2011).

However, as this is a worthwhile initiative, it would be appropriate for the Council to contribute \$2,000 (financial \$1,210; in-kind \$790) towards the Family Fun Day since other state government agencies are involved, and as project partners would also be contributing towards this event.

The suggested contribution by Council, totalling \$2,000, can be funded under the Community Development budget.

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Relationship to City Plan

Direction 2c: Strong partnerships between Council, community groups and government agencies.

Financial impact statement

No additional financial impact on the Council as the \$2,000 can be accommodated under the Community Development budget 2011-12.

Conclusion

The Matraville Family Fun Day, scheduled for 25 November 2011, will give social housing residents and their families the opportunity to celebrate their diversity, develop relationships with the local community, and gain information about community services. It is therefore a worthy community event for the Council to make a \$2,000 financial contribution outside its grants programs.

Recommendation

That:

- a) Council approve the provision of in-kind contribution of \$790 and a cash contribution of \$1,210, totalling \$2,000, towards the Matraville Family Fun Day, to be funded from the Community Development budget;and
- b) Note that the information about the Council's community grants programs, application forms and details of application closing dates will be provided to members of WFGU, should they decide to seek financial assistance from the Council in future.
- c) WFGU be advised of the need to give adequate and appropriate acknowledgement for the Council's contribution to the running of this event. Such acknowledgement to include Council's logo for inclusion on promotional literature.

Guest Speaker: Tony Lehmann, Manager Integrated Transport

The following parking and traffic related matters were discussed at the meeting:

- Billie spoke about parking issues at the Prince Henry Nursing and Medical Museum at 2 Brodie Avenue Little Bay, particularly during the current construction period at the site.
- Billee requested for consideration to be given to the creation of a new mobility parking space at the front of the museum.
- Concerns about traffic issues and the existing bollards within the roads near the museum. (Tony noted that only some of the roads on the Prince Henry site have been handed over to Council).
- Linda requested that the existing bollards at Curie and Darwin Avenue are retained to prevent through traffic, as opening this road to additional traffic would create significant conflict and danger for members and staff of the Coast Centre.
- Tony will check the DA for approval any variation to the bollards.
- Concerns that the Prince of Wales Hospital did not recognise the accepted practice regarding enforcement of parking restrictions when vehicles display an RTA Mobility parking card. George raised this issue at the meeting after he was told to move on from a half hour parking zone at the hospital despite displaying a mobility parking card.
- Ron requested for consideration to be given for an additional mobility parking space at high street outside the POW Hospital, as there is only 1 space currently available.
- Tony to provide Frida with a list of any new mobility parking spaces in Randwick City.
- Tony spoke in detail about the study underway into an extension of Sydney's light rail network to Randwick linking UNSW, Royal Randwick Racecourse and the retail hub of Randwick.
- Council is working with the STA in regards to improving the design of roundabouts and other traffic devices, and with the RTA to try and put signals back on crossings to improve access for pedestrians, and also as a reminder to motorists.
- Council have funds of \$100, 000 to upgrade bus stops – Council are rolling out the program by building concrete pads at bus stop in Randwick City, to

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ensure bus stops are positioned to let passengers down on the kerbside to further avoid injury.

- Committee members thanked Tony for attending the meeting.
